ERASMUS+

EU program in the field of education, training, youth and sport for the period 2021-2027

- STUDENT MOBILITY FOR STUDY: Study at a partner institution abroad must last at least 2 months and can last a maximum of 12 months.
- STUDENT MOBILITY FORTRAINEESHIP: The period of practical training is limited to a minimum of 2 months (min. 60 days) to a maximum of 12 months.

 SUITABLE FOR INTERNSHIP minimum of 2 months.
- STUDENT MOBILITY FOR INTERNSHIP: Undertaking an internship in a company or any other relevant workplace that young graduates can take part in during the 12 months after graduation.

MINIMUM CONDITIONS FOR MOBILITY

- During the entire period of study abroad, the student will have an **active** status of a student at the home faculty of the University of Maribor;
- During his studies abroad, the student will **not exceed the maximum total duration of mobility** (Erasmus+ study and internship).
- The home faculty can set additional criteria, such as: motivation, academic success, knowledge of the language of the host country...

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF OBLIGATIONS

The study obligations in the study agreement (Learning Agreement for Studies) agreed before going abroad and confirmed by the partner institution, which the student successfully completes at the partner institution abroad, **will be recognized at FT UM upon return**

Recognition of successfully completed obligations can only be refused if the student has not reached the level of knowledge/qualification required by the host institution or has otherwise failed to fulfill the agreed obligations and conditions regarding recognition.

In order to be approved for a financial grant, students must collect:

- min. 10 ECTS for the trimester and
- min. 20 ECTS for the semester and
- min. 40 ECTS for the academic year

FINANCES

- The Erasmus+ grant only co-finances the costs of living abroad and does not cover the costs in full.
- An Erasmus student is not automatically entitled to an Erasmus+ financial grant.
- The grant can only be approved for the duration of regular study obligations in accordance with the academic calendar at the partner institution.
- A student who receives an Erasmus+ financial grant continues to be entitled to receive any national scholarship.

FINANCES

The Erasmus grant amounts for the 2023/2024 academic year for each country group are:

| Host country | Monthly amount (EUR) |

| Group 1 – higher living costs: Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Ireland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden, the United Kingdom | 600 EUR/month |
| Group 2 – medium living costs: Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Malta, the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain | 600 EUR/month |
| Group 3 – lower living costs: Bulgaria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Polan Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, North Macedonia, Turkey | d, 540 EUR/month |

FINANCES

SUPPLEMENT FOR STUDENTS WITH LESS OPPORTUNITIES

• Students who meet the conditions of one of the 8 groups of participants with fewer opportunities will be able to apply for additional financial resources of the Erasmus+ program.

INTEGRATION SUPPORT FOR PARTICIPANTS

 Students with special needs who will be granted an Erasmus grant can apply for additional financial resources from the Erasmus+ program.

GREENTRAVEL SUPPLEMENT

• A green trip is defined as a trip that uses low-emission means of transport, such as bus, train or car sharing, for the majority of the trip.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- Find a partner institution where you would like to go on mobility. FT UM has around 40 Erasmus+ partner institutions in several countries. List is available here: https://www.ft.um.si/wp-content/uploads/IIA-FT-seznam-partnerskih-drzav.pdf
- 2. Check the Visa requirements.
- 3. Check the courses at a foreign university and their match with courses at FT UM.
- **4.** Fill the internal application (document on FT website) and send it to Erasmus coordinator Tomi Spindler (tomi.spindler(aum.si)
- 5. Together we will review the application and course matching. If everything is appropriate, you will fulfill the **Learning agreement**.
- 6. You will **aplly for Erasmus mobility** at https://studentexchange.um.si/ADPrijava.aspx
- **7. Your nomination will be sent to host institution**. You will get additional information from host institution.
- 8. You will fill out the application for obtaining an Erasmus+ financial grant.

INTERNSHIP

- If students already work in the field during their studies (for example, through student work), they can also count up to 80% of the quota hours for their internship. The work must be strictly related to their field of study, such as working at the reception, in marketing, or at a travel agency...
- Every March, we organize a Career Fair in Brežice, to which students are cordially invited.
- Students can do their internship abroad Erasmus+ Traineeship
- Students find internships on their own. However, if they have trouble finding one, we have a list of partner organizations on our website with which we cooperate well, and they can contact them.
- In all matters, the mentor at FT is the one who provides support in all phases, so students should feel free to reach out to assist. prof. dr. Boris Prevolšek
